Dear Mr. Mansbridge:

By the time this letter reaches you my husband will be in Europe. After official business has been taken care of on the Continent he will go to England. If his schedule goes as planned, he should be in London about March 10th, perhaps a little before, perhaps a little after that date, for a few days only.

On one or two occasions in the past it proved unfortunate that his presence in Europe was unknown to someone over there with whom a conference would have been advantageous to both. I hope, therefore, that I am not being presumptuous in informing you of his expected presence in London, so that if deemed desirable for him to be consulted by anyone connected with the Cambridge University Press, this could be arranged.
