

FRIEDMAN LECTURES

Six lectures, fifty minutes each, to cover:

1. Basic terminology and an account of cryptology from the earliest days of the invention and development of secret writings, and devices or means for secret communication, and of means and methods of solving such writings, devices, and means for secret communications.
2. Cryptology in the 15th and 16th Centuries.
3. Cryptology (American and British) during the Revolutionary War, and the period thereafter up to the time of the Civil War.
4. Cryptology (Federal and Confederate) during the Civil War.
5. Cryptology from the end of the Civil War to the end of World War I.
6. Cryptology from the end of WW I to the end of WW II, unclassified material only.

Uses of lectures:

1. Orientation of new employees in cryptologic sciences.
2. Providing historical background of cryptology to analysts, thereby enhancing their professional attitudes.
3. Lectures will record, in usable form, information that is not now available in the government.
4. Lectures will be written to be used either as a series or as individual lectures.

Contract Details:

1. Cost: Mr. Friedman asks \$10,000. - This sum is open to negotiation.
2. Duration of Contract: One year - Each lecture with accompanying visual materials to be delivered to NSA as it is completed.
3. Rights: Mr. Friedman agrees to relinquish all rights to the material on a royalty free, non-exclusive and irrevocable license.
4. Property and assistance: Clerical assistance - use of secretary two days per week (Miss Young), Electric typewriter, dictating-reproducing recorder, facilities for preparing slides, etc.
