Minutes of Meeting Held 17 January 1945

- 1. CONSTITUTE TO MINITIA OF STRIMETING Reference Item 4, the Chief of the Laboratory Branch reported that as a result of informal discussions with the Cryptographic Branch, process negative production could be expected to increase about 50% in order to meet cryptographic requests from Southmest Pacific area and European Theater of Operations. He stated that such requests could be met without additional personnal by producing process negatives on a three shift basis.
- 2. FEFORT OF STAFF MILLS Colonel Cook reported the following information which resulted from the Staff Heeting of 15 January 1945:
- a. Efficiency Reports Colemal Cordennan desired that efficer efficiency ratings below the grade of "Excellent" be reviewed and that such efficers be considered in light of their qualifications for possible adjustment involving medification of jeb assigned, training or reassignment.
- b. Correspondence It was requested that correspondence returned for revision be completely reviewed for all corrections mecessary.
- o. <u>Promotion of 2nd Ligutenents</u> It was requested that all recommendations for promotion of officers to the grade of let Ligutenant, who have been in grade 18 months or over and whose officiency warrants promotion, be subsisted promptly.
- J. PRIORITY OF ASSIGNMENT OF PERSONNEL As a result of a request from the Parsonnal and Training Division, the feasibility of setting up a priority for assignment of personnal to the branches within the Operating Services Division was discussed. As only the Supply and Communications Branches are involved in setting up such priorities, it was considered advisable to settle questions on priority of assignment of personnal at the time they cour, rather than devise a plan on a theoretical basis, at the present time. It was recommended that when the question of assignment of personnal arises within the Division, the matter be referred to the Division Chief for decision.
- 4. TRAINING OF FER COMES AND ICHED TO STATIONS Colonel Cook reported that Colonel Corderman had requested that personnel to be assigned to overseas stations be adequately trained to meet their responsibilities. In addition, they should be given some training and experience in duties other than in their specialty prior to departure.

5. TIME MECHANICAL ASSETS - A question concerning the proposed time-recording system was raised with respect to its efficiency in operation. Colonal Cock stated that this matter was one which concerned Branch Personnel Officers and should not be made subject to discussion at this meeting in the absence of the Personnel Officer.

46. IBH FUNDS - With respect to the bulget for the Signal Security Agency, the Justion was considered concerning the use of Signal Security Agency funds for rental of IBM equipment in the theaters. After some discussion of the matter, Colonal Cook requested that the Chiefs of the Machine Branch and Supply Branch investigate the situation, on the basis that funds should be provided by the theaters for such equipment.
