SUBJECT: COMSEC Analysis Report (Final) of MATO Fall Exercises--

- 1. Attached for your information are copies of our COMESC Analysis Report (Final) of RATO Fall Emercises -- 1960. As you no doubt recall, we discussed this briefly during your recent visits. The results of the analysis have been checked against SACEUR's Atomic Strike Flan end, in general, our report presents a fair picture of SACEUR's proposed atomic strike operations.
- 2. Although communications security seemed to be somewhat improved over previous large scale NATO emercises, considerable information was obtained by an emmination of the traffic. As the report states, the major insecurity is the large volume of plain language communications (both teleprinter and telephone). It is hoped that the report will aid the Supreme Commands (primarily SACHER) in obtaining funds for the procurement of additional cryptographic equipment.
- 3. The content of the report was discussed informally with members of the Befense Atomic Support Agency to insure that none of the information is especially sensitive or U. S. EYES ONLY.
