SUBJECT: Inclusion of Commercial Cryptographic Material on the International Embargo List

1. A meeting was held on 3 December 1954 at the Department of State in the effice of Mr. T. A. Polymoides, for purposes of discussing the above subject. The following were present:

S. Colonal Libert reviewed the situation as it had developed in a recent COCOM meeting in Paris. At that time the various members of COCOM presented their revisions of certain portions of the International Erbargo list for consideration. The specific item concerned, i.e., commercial aryptographic equipment, had been retained on the lists presented by some of the mations but the U.K. wished to remove the item. The reasons given were of a general nature, and Colonel Libert believed that the U.K. member was following the usual U.K. policy of removing as many items from the embargo list as possible for purely economic reasons.

- 5. The V.S. member was unprepared for this item and asked for instructions from Washington.
- As the moment no real problem exists for NSA, but if there could be a choice, it would be preferable to have no commercially available appropriate items on the list. Although Mr. Polymoides could appreciate this position, the real reasons could not be given to Fr. Pomercy and Celonal Libert. Hr. Friedman pointed out, however, that of the summercial concerns known to him, the two of greater importance were in sountries not members of COCOM and, therefore, not subject to any provisions of COCOM. Mr. Friedman stated that there were no manufacturers at summercial cryptographic equipment in the skritish Commonwealth of Nations, and of other manufacturers known there appeared to be no reason to be concerned about any sales of their equipment to the Soviet Bloc.
- 5. The meeting endsi with agreement on a U.S. position not to press for retention of this sert of item on the International Embargo List.
