This will be a short note to tell you of my safe arrival home after a very pleasant TWA trans-Atlantic flight.

I was, however, much disappointed in the fact that my stuff from Seffridge's was not abourd the plane. I was more than disappointed, in fact quite annoyed, because I went to the trouble of making a special visit to the Export Department at Seffridge's the day before I took off, to assure myself that they had everything laid on properly. They said they had.

I have initiated a tracer from this end with the TWA people and now am writing to ask if you would be good enough to have somebody to go over to Seffridge's and start a tracer from that end on Export Card Number B 44567. The package contained one overcoat, one sports jacket, three cardigans and four pairs of argyle socks; total value approximately \$200.

If it was Seffridge's fault that the stuff was not put aboard, I shall expect them to bear the cost of shipment by air direct to me at my home address which I quoted above. I shall be able to get the stuff through U.S. customs OK because I declared it on my form on arrival, for later delivery.

I have already received from Zug a receipt for the \$10 I paid for changing my air travel ticket from tourist to 1st class. If you need it, let me know and I'll send it to you.
