UK/US Communications Security Conference, 1953 (JCS 2074/29)

- 1. I learned informally late Monday afternoon (8 February 1954) that the Air Force, with concurrence of the Mary, may propose the following changes in the Report of the UK/US Communications Security Conference, 1953, published in JCS 2074/29.
- a. Page 168, peragraph 5s, line 2 Propose changing "APSAM 7" to read "APSAN 7/478".

Comment: I agree with the proposed change, but for accuracy, recommend that the following statement be inserted after "AFSAN 7":

"and AFBAN 47B, of which the AFBAN 7 is . . . "

Comment: For accuracy, I recommend that this should read: Page 169, line 2 - Propose changing "APSAM 7" to rend "APSAM 7/478".

"AFBAN 7 and AFBAN 478"

c. Page 169, paragraph 5g - Propose deleting all after line 3, i.e., the second sub-paragraph.

I recommend that the paragraph remain in the Report. Comment: I do not concur in deletion of this paragraph. If fac-simile security equipments are to be developed for combined use it is necessary that the communications means first be agreed on.

the second line. Page 171 - Propose deleting sub-paragraphs (1) through (4) after

Comment: Sub-paragraphs (1) and (2) are true statements and I believe must be brought to the attention of the Joint Chiefe of Staff. Sub-paragraphs (3) and (4) propose a course of action which should lead to correction of the conditions reported in sub-paragraphs (1) and (2). I recommend retention of the four sub-paragraphs, but, if it is considered messessary, sub-paragraphs (3) and (4) can be deleted.

2. I also learned informally that the Army may propose that the Report be sent to APSAC (Armed Forces Security Agency Council). I believe this is unnecessary because Service representatives were present at the Conference, and unnecessary delay would be occasioned by such an action. Furthermore, AFSAC has been quite inactive for more than a year. Report not be referred to AFSAC. I recu

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
