Hemr Mr. Morton:

It has been a year now since my last correspondence with Dr. Norm and yourself in regard to your possible appointment as a number of the National Security Agency Scientific Advisory Board. I regret that the collection of the information required for the special clearance needed for our work has taken so long. Newser, the clearance action has now been satisfactorily completed.

As you may remember, the Board was established a year ago to someth up in finding ensuers to certain problems of vital importance in the Mational Defense. I inclose a copy of a document which sets forth the mission and functions of the Board, the Chairman which is still Dr. Btewart S. Cairns, Mead of the Department of Mathematics, University of Illinois. Other members of the Board was: Mr. Donald A. Quarles, Assistant Secretary of Defense (R/D); Mr. W. R. G. Maker, Vice President, General Electric Company; Mr. M. P. Corvith, Vice President, Vestern Union Telegraph Company; Mr. Mountd T. Magatron, Vice President, Engineering Research Associates Mivision of Memington Mand, Inc.; Mr. John C. McPherson, Vice President, International Enginess Hackines Corporation; Dr. Moward P. Mebertson, California Institute of Technology; Dr. John von Memmann, Institute for Advanced Study, Princeton University; and Dr. S. M. Wilks, Department of Mathematics, Princeton University.

In addition to the Board itself, panels covering the fields of electronics, mathematics, and telecommunications are being activated to serve under the Board. The Board newbers will not be called upon more frequently than two or three times a year to attend formal meetings of the Board. We place more amphasis upon individual consultation, meening that Board members place themselves at our disposal only for such consultation as their own time and convenience affords. It is hardly necessary to indicate that, when attending Board meetings, or serving in a consultative capacity, the deverment will pay the cost of travel and a consultant's fee not to exceed \$50.00 per day.
